

The COVID-19 Lament

The unprecedented stress caused by the COVID-19 epidemic and attendant precautionary measures will reverberate throughout the Arts Community for the next several years. The artistic penalty suffered by dancers' inability to dance, rehearse and perform, the physical loss in the talent pool from those who walked away, and the crushing financial losses from curtailed event revenue and charitable support have created myriads of issues. COVID-forced seclusion in itself took a heavy toll on youngsters' psyche as did the resultant de-socialization of mask wearing, closed schools and public gathering facilities and isolation from family and friends. As we slowly become resolved as a nation that we must live with COVID and similar scourges, we must adjust accordingly. Things will never be quite the same, particularly our level of expectations.

It is a testament to the resiliency of human beings that an innate sense of hope springs eternal. Although two years plus of their youth have been stolen, these performers are determined to match and exceed the achievements of previous generations. BESFI salutes the brave of heart. As we look back over the past forty plus years of BESFI at the Staller Center (1980-2022), a plethora of stars have graced the Staller stage and careers have been launched. We hope to continue this tradition into the future.

No salute would be complete without acknowledging those who have steadfastly supported BESFI through these lean times. With no journals available in 2020 and 2021, recognition has been utterly lacking. A brief summary follows:

Kari Kaczmarek's 1986 cover artwork for Street People has been brought back to life this year as a tribute to past contributions and a reminder that the classics stand the test of time. In another show high point, the *Le Corsaire* Pas de Deux features Mr. Rojas on two successive performances opposite principals Lara Caraiani and Kyra Allgaier. Guest artists Diana Atoian, Brianna Jimenez and Jenna Lee will regale us with solo performances. Spirited character dances complete the 2022 BESFI offering.

BESFI PERFORMANCE 2019 ~ IN REVIEW

Seiskaya Ballet's BESFI 2019 Takes a Modern Approach with Classical Standards

Dancing ballet and watching ballet are two very different things. But if the dancing is executed at a high-enough caliber, the watching becomes a sport itself. It requires active participation and attention, because the energy is pulsing, vibrant, and ALIVE. This is exactly the experience of watching Seiskaya Ballet's annual Ballet Education and Scholarship Fund Inc. performance this past spring. The dancers, all whom have taken the Staller Center stage many times, took their rightful places under the spotlight, and put their own twist on classical ballet standards.

Up first was a personal favorite, one that I danced back in my days at Seiskaya Ballet, called Flower Festival in Genzano Pas de Deux. Danced by Julia Virnelli and Guest Artist Daniel Wagner, I was impressed at the pair's clean execution and sweet on-stage chemistry. It was a delightful way to kick off the show. The premiere of Altalena followed, which showcased the Corps de Ballet's striking harmony, as they danced together as one unit to create stunning shapes across the stage. Sgouramani's choreography is both lyrical and athletic, which made for an exciting piece to behold.

The evening continued to deliver with the timeless classic La Esmeralda Pas de Deux, danced by Brianna Jimenez and Guest Artist Alvin Tovstogray. A Seiskaya Ballet veteran, Jimenez unsurprisingly 1

delivered strong technique and panache, but it was her confidence that set the stage on fire—and Tovstogray matched her with ease. Punctuated by the delightful Kazachok that gave the Junior Corps de Ballet a chance to shine, Act I closed with the terrific, yet less-performed classical standard: Grand Pas Classique. Graciela Carrero-Sagona and Daniel Wagner danced with stylistic finesse. Carrero-Sagona's natural facilities are boundless sky-high extensions, precise pirouettes, ease of movement—and you can truly feel the passion she has for ballet. But what was more impressive was the synchronicity between her and Wagner, because it felt natural and spontaneous.

For Act II, Seiskaya Ballet strayed from their traditional BESFI format in favor of a full-length ballet in the form of La Bayadère Divertissement, adapted by Kikna's unique perspective on Petipa's choreography. A timeless love story fraught with intense betrayal and satisfying redemption, it was so exciting to see the company commit to an entire ballet that demanded an incredible amount of resilience and power.

As Gamzatti, Diana Atoian was expectedly striking. A dancer whose confidence and bravura precedes her, Atoian demands the audience watch her—and only her—and that's just something you can't teach. Similarly, but in different ways, Jenna Lee as Nikiya brought her own blend of dynamics to the mix. Lee has continued to evolve into an incredibly thoughtful dancer, one whose every arabesque and pique turn has meaning. The two are so different, but complemented each other beautifully. La Bayadère Divertissement was also special to watch, because it gave more dancers the opportunity to stand out. Notable examples include the Pas de Quatre and the Jump Dance.

With each passing year, I'm reminded more and more how privileged I am to witness this company continue to grow and evolve. As a former dancer of ballet, it's now an honor to be a watcher.

BESFI SCHOLARSHIPS


Due to the financial impact of COVID-19 restrictions and closures (2020 & 2021) and stay-at-home-orders, the cumulative effect contributed student malaise and reduced participation. BESFI was unable to award scholarship fund money for the 2021 Summer Program because of depleted resources. Preliminarily, early receipts indicate that the 2022 program may suffer the same financial fate. Increased costs at the Staller Center and sharply rising inflation rates have hampered efforts in 2022 to attract additional ad revenues. 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VALIA SEISKAYA



Russian-born Valia Seiskaya took her first ballet lessons in Greece at the age of six. Her teacher was Adam Morianoff, also a Russian émigré. (Valia was experiencing difficulty learning Greek; thus, it was natural for her mother to seek out a fellow countryman.) At nine she became a scholarship student, showing prodigious technique—for example, entrechat huit, eight beats, in centre—by age ten. Pointe work also started at ten, character ballet at twelve. Thereafter, Mme. Seiskaya rapidly developed the combination of strong technique and high elevation which would become her hallmark as a

professional.

At fifteen, Valia continued her training under Sonia Morianova, the niece of Adam Morianoff, who had recently retired from the National Opera of Greece. She became a member of the National Opera at seventeen, soon attaining the rank of featured soloist, and touring Europe and Russia with the company. At the National Theater her preparation continued under resident ballet masters and choreographers, including the Bolshoi's Asaf Messerer, Boris Kniazev, Nina Kyrsanova and Olympia Yelodari (former judge at the *International Ballet* Competitions held in Varna, Bulgaria and Moscow).

In Greece, as in most European countries, ballet students wishing to become professionals must pass comprehensive national level examinations and obtain a license. Mme. Seiskaya fulfilled all of her requirements and was granted both a diploma and a license.

The Seiskaya Ballet School was founded in 1974, one year after Mme. Seiskaya retired from the National Opera of Greece. At that time she taught all fifteen class sections. In 1976 Studio A was doubled in size to its present 2,500 square feet, and in 1981 Studio B was opened, adding another 1,500 square feet to the dance facility. That year also saw the establishment of the Seiskaya Ballet Academy.

The Academy was designed as a professional training program for serious dancers who display the determination, physical attributes and musicality of the career-oriented dancer. Admission to the Academy is by audition only. Since the inception of the Seiskaya Ballet programs, eighty students have opted for professional careers. The OPEN program was developed in 2006 to complement the Academy and accommodate requests for more scheduling flexibility.

All Academy students are encouraged to participate in the guest teacher seminars and summer workshop programs offered by the Ballet Education and Scholarship Fund, Inc. (BESFI). As part of their professional preparation, Academy students' participation in auditions for company schools, summer workshops, internships and major dance companies is routinely encouraged.

Seiskaya students have compiled an outstanding record of achievement. 4 Through the years, full scholarships have been awarded by every major institution

for which they have auditioned, including schools affiliated with American Ballet Theatre (ABT), New York City Ballet, and the San Francisco, Houston, Joffrey, Pacific Northwest, Pittsburgh, Eliot Feld, and Boston Ballets. Some of the many dance companies Seiskaya students have joined: ABT (5), Atlanta Ballet (2), Boston (2), Ballet West, Fort Worth, Hartford, Pacific Northwest, Pittsburgh, Royal Swedish, State Ballet of Missouri, Ballet Arizona, Tennessee, Milwaukee (3), New Jersey, Alabama, Washington, Louisville, Austin, Tulsa Ballets and Momix.

In 1994 Seiskaya student Michael Cusumano captured a bronze medal and Special Commendation at the International Ballet Competition (IBC) in Varna, Bulgaria and a coveted Jury Award (a gold medal-level award) at the *Prix de Danse*, Paris, France. Valia Seiskaya was nominated that year as the Best Teacher and Coach at Varna, one of the few Americans ever to be so honored.

In 1996 Kirov student Rasta Thomas, coached by Valia Seiskaya, reached the pinnacle: a gold medal in the Men's Junior Division at the 17th IBC, Varna, Bulgaria. Incredibly, he was the first American male dancer ever to win a Junior Division gold and the youngest male dancer ever to do so. In addition, his triumph ended a sixteen-year stretch in which no gold medal was awarded in the Junior Men's Division.

In 1998 Seiskaya student Elizabeth McGrath represented the U.S. in the 18th IBC in Varna, Bulgaria. In late '98 she was a top finalist in the 8th Concours International de Danse de Paris, France. Among the numerous awards earned during the current decade: Anna Craddock earned 2nd prize in the 2008 American Ballet Competition, Miami, Fl. and in 2009, the grand prize in the 9th International Dance Competition - Hellas (Greece). Seiskaya alum Cory Stearns (ABT principal) won the vaunted 2008 Erik Bruhn Prize in Toronto, Canada. Karissa Kralik captured 2nd place honors in the 2010, Senior Division, American Ballet Competition. In 2012, Danielle Lovetro earned 2nd place in the regional Youth American Grand Prix while Anna Craddock swept to a 1st place finish at the American Ballet Competition in Houston, Texas and a 1st place finish in the senior division at the 2013 YAGP regional. Seiskaya students have captured more than twenty national/regional awards, including those from the National Arts and Letters Competition; National Arts Recognition and Talent Competition (Presidential Scholar in the Arts); Saraband, Ltd; and the Amilita Hoffman Memorial Ballet Competition.

During her seventeen-year professional career with the National Opera of Greece, Mme. Seiskaya gained an affinity for the grand sweep of story-line ballets and operas staged by the company. Her own choreographic works, such as **Street** People, Las Damiselas, Forest, MASK, and the Nutcracker, reflect that interest. Fresh interpretations of classical favorites La Boutique Fantasque, Walpurgis Night and A Night on Bald Mountain complement her signature ensemble works Grand Waltz, Seasons and Dance of the Hours.

Valia Seiskaya is listed in Who's Who Among Outstanding Americans and was The Village Times 1985 Woman of the Year in the Arts. Thrice, she has been awarded Teacher of the Year by YAGP. She has received commendations from, among others, President Reagan, Governor Pataki and Congressman Forbes. In 2011, Mme. Seiskaya was elected to the Long Island Volunteer Hall of Fame for her work nurturing young talented dancers. Valia Seiskaya is Long Island's grande dame of ballet.



JOSÉ ROJAS

A dancer is the sum total of his training and environment. José Rojas' eclectic dance training features a plethora of character, classical ballet and contemporary training and dance roles. A full scholarship student at the Joffrey Ballet School, his early training was primarily in Argentina with several noted instructors. Steeped in the Latin American folkloric traditions of Argentina, Venezuela and Mexico, an extended professional affiliation was born with the Calpulli Mexican Dance Company. Their repertoire tells stories using the languages of dance, music and the Hispanic ethnos to connect on universal messages of love and hope. Classics such as the Nutcracker were given an ethnic twist. José Rojas brings that same energy, verve and flair to classical ballet. He has danced the pas from Nutcracker, Sleeping Beauty, Le Corsaire, Spartacus, Spring Waters and La Bayadère. Performing with the Connecticut Ballet and other ensembles, he performed in original and adaptations of: Legends of the Forest, Dracula and Other Classic Tales, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Don Quixote, Giselle, La Fille mal gardée and Puebla: The Story of Cinco de Mayo. Physical prowess and a pleasing aesthetic are God-given, however heart and warmth are life-nurtured. Enjoy the melding of these two facets as Mr. Rojas dances the Le Corsaire Pas and the *Policeman* in **Street People**.

DIANA ATOIAN

With strikingly expressive features and the perfect blend of ethereal grace and technical exactitude, this former Principal Dancer will once again enchant audiences during this weekend's BESFI performances. Diana returns to the stage in one of her favorite roles, Nikiya, to perform the variation Nikiya's Death Scene from La Bayadère. Following her 2019 BESFI performance as Nikiya's nemesis, Gamzatti, she received the rave review, "Diana Atoian was expectedly striking. A dancer whose confidence and bravura precedes her, Atoian demands the audience watch her—and only her and that's just something you can't teach." Diana portrayed *Kitri* from **Don Quixote** in BESFI 2018 dancing opposite Alvin Tovstogray in the ballet's pas de deux. She again garnered praise from the Smithtown Messenger. "A calm and collected dancer with confidence to spare, Atoian brings her truest self to every ballet she dances..." During her tenure at Seiskaya, Diana was a top finisher in each of her six years in the BESFI competition. In 2016, she competed on the international stage, winning 3rd place in the Hellas International Competition in Athens, Greece. She is currently attending Stony Brook University and pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Economics. Diana has been a member of the Stony Brook Dance Team for three consecutive years.









BRIANNA JIMENEZ

Brianna has an exceptional talent born of focus and passion for her craft. A dance major at Fordham University, this former Principal Dancer epitomizes the rare combination of clean lines, flawless technique and sublime grace. During her stint at Seiskaya, Brianna accomplished what most can only dream of-mastering the demanding choreography of Sugar Plum whilst transporting the audience to an ethereal world with her poignant interpretation of the role. Her performances as an effervescent Dew Drop and a captivating Clara were equally mesmerizing, and her rendition of Chocolate Soldier was precisely executed and no less memorable. Brianna's 2019 Nutcracker performance garnered the rave review of Christina Pandolfi from the Smithtown Messenger: "Yet it was Brianna Jimenez as the Sugar Plum who stole the show." About her 2019 BESFI performance of the timeless Esmeralda Pas de Deux, the Smithtown Messenger quipped, "A Seiskaya Ballet veteran, Jimenez unsurprisingly delivered strong technique and panache, but it was her confidence that set the stage on fire..." Brianna's recent return to the stage in Nutcracker 2021 as a "serene" Arabian was "very welcome", noted the Nutcracker Herald. This BESFI weekend, we are thrilled that she will be showcasing a contemporary dance, one of her most beloved art forms.





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

JENNA LEE

A former Seiskaya Principal Dancer, Jenna will perform two powerhouse variations this weekend. Each of these dynamic roles showcases her artistry, musicality and charm. First, Jenna takes the stage as Laurencia, the main character that shares the name with the ballet. Her effortless strength abounds with each and every fouetté and jump. Later, Jenna will storm the stage in the riveting, fast paced La Fille mal gardée variation in the role of Lise. She will again astound the audience with crisp, clean technique, magnificent leaps and turns. Fearless in her roles, a trait signifying her Seiskaya career, Jenna portrayed the role of the temptress Nikiya in BESFI 2019's La Bayadère. Following her performance Smithtown Messenger opined "...Jenna Lee as Nikiya brought her own blend of dynamics to the mix. Lee has continued to evolve into an incredibly thoughtful dancer, one whose every arabesque and piqué turn has meaning...." During Nutcracker 2021 she returned to Seiskaya and performed her favorite Nutcracker role, the Chocolate Soldier. With each sweeping Baryshnikov turn, churned with pin point accuracy, the crowd clapped along as she then concluded this daunting role to thunderous applause. Fresh off completing her third year at Sacred Heart University, Jenna is a Biology major and member of the Sacred Heart University Dance Company.

Le Corsaire Pas de Deux

Based on a poem by Byron, the ballet's plot involves a pirate (*Corsaire*) and a beautiful girl, *Medora*, sold to a rich pasha by her guardian. In this interlude, the slave *Ali* pledges his devotion to *Medora* after rescuing her from the evil pasha. After many adventures, she is reunited with her first love, the pirate. Margot Fontaine and Rudolf Nureyev were the first to dance the pas de deux with the Royal Ballet.

Character Dance Minatures

A testament to Mme. Guzikova's ingenuity, *Persian, Siberian* and *Carmen* dances are a blend of energetic synchronized choreographic patterns, vibrant colored costumes with enchanting folk rhythms that yield toe-tapping and finger-snapping excitement. The Character Ballet Teacher for several years at ABT, she often collaborated on BESFI projects.

Laurencia

Based on a play by the 17th century Spanish dramatist Lope de Vega, Laurencia was choreographed by Vakhtang Chabukiani, a Georgian dancer from the Soviet era. The story unfolds as the tyrannical ruler Don Fernan becomes obsessed with *Laurencia*, a beautiful peasant girl who rejects his advances. Furious, Don Fernan sabotages her wedding to fiancé Frondoso and imprisons them both. The feisty Laurencia manages to escape and incites the villagers to rise up against the wicked Don. Together, they storm the castle, capture the evil ruler and set Frondoso free. Laurencia was premiered at the Kirov Theater in 1939, with Natalia Dudinskaya dancing as *Laurencia* and Chabuiakni himself dancing as Frondoso.

La Bayadère

The iconic 19th-century Russian ballet, La Bayadère was first performed at the Bolshoi Theatre in St Petersburg in 1877. The enduring tale of love, betrayal, and redemption is considered one of the best-loved classical ballets of all time. *Nikiya*, a temple dancer, is in love with the warrior *Solor*. The High Brahmin also desires *Nikiya*, and when she rejects him, he plans to take revenge on *Solor*. When the High Brahmin tells the Rajah about *Solor's* secret love, the Rajah decides that *Nikiya*, not Solor, should be killed. *Princess Gamzatti* is to be married to *Solor*. She overhears and tries to bribe *Nikiya* to give up *Solor*, but *Nikiya*

refuses. The Rajah and *Gamzatti* arrange for *Nikiya* to be killed by a snake bite during the engagement festivities. Despondent, *Solor* is filled with remorse and haunted by visions of *Nikiya*. In the afterlife, *Solor* and *Nikiya* are finally united.

La Fille Mal Gardée

The excerpted pas de deux from the comic ballet, **La Fille Mal Gardée**, portrays the lovers, *Lisette* and *Colin*, attempting to deal with her arranged betrothal to another man.

Street People

Set in contemporary American working class neighborhood in transition, the ballet depicts life on a city block which is a buffer between a large private school and a low income housing project. The central character is a young, homeless girl who has become street smart and street tough. Cautious but lonely, she befriends a bag lady and the local beat cop. In the opening scene, the bag lady, as a friendly gesture, gives the street urchin the gift of a scarf to which the youngster becomes very attached. 


The neighborhood patrolman cannot resist flirting with the pretty local school librarian. Observed by his undercover policewoman fiancé, he lands in hot water.
