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

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VALIA SEISKAYA



Russian-born Valia Seiskaya took her first ballet lessons in Greece at the age of six. Her teacher was Adam Morianoff, also a Russian émigré. (Valia was experiencing difficulty learning Greek; thus, it was natural for her mother to seek out a fellow countryman.) At nine she became a scholarship student, showing prodigious technique—for example, entrechat huit, eight beats, in centre—by age ten. Pointe work also started at ten, character ballet at twelve. Thereafter, Mme. Seiskaya rapidly developed the combination of strong technique and high elevation which would become her hallmark as a

professional.

At fifteen, Valia continued her training under Sonia Morianova, the niece of Adam Morianoff, who had recently retired from the National Opera of Greece. She became a member of the National Opera at seventeen, soon attaining the rank of featured soloist, and touring Europe and Russia with the company. At the National Theater her preparation continued under resident ballet masters and choreographers, including the Bolshoi's Asaf Messerer, Boris Kniazev, Nina Kyrsanova and Olympia Yelodari (former judge at the *International Ballet* Competitions held in Varna, Bulgaria and Moscow).

In Greece, as in most European countries, ballet students wishing to become professionals must pass comprehensive national level examinations and obtain a license. Mme. Seiskaya fulfilled all of her requirements and was granted both a diploma and a license.

The Seiskaya Ballet School was founded in 1974, one year after Mme. Seiskaya retired from the National Opera of Greece. At that time she taught all fifteen class sections. In 1976 Studio A was doubled in size to its present 2,500 square feet, and in 1981 Studio B was opened, adding another 1,500 square feet to the dance facility. That year also saw the establishment of the Seiskaya Ballet Academy.

The Academy was designed as a professional training program for serious dancers who display the determination, physical attributes and musicality of the career-oriented dancer. Admission to the Academy is by audition only. Since the inception of the Seiskaya Ballet programs, eighty students have opted for professional careers. The OPEN program was developed in 2006 to complement the Academy and accommodate requests for more scheduling flexibility.

All Academy students are encouraged to participate in the guest teacher seminars and summer workshop programs offered by the Ballet Education and Scholarship Fund, Inc. (BESFI). As part of their professional preparation, Academy students' participation in auditions for company schools, summer workshops, internships and major dance companies is routinely encouraged.

Seiskaya students have compiled an outstanding record of achievement. 4 Through the years, full scholarships have been awarded by every major institution

for which they have auditioned, including schools affiliated with American Ballet Theatre (ABT), New York City Ballet, and the San Francisco, Houston, Joffrey, Pacific Northwest, Pittsburgh, Eliot Feld, and Boston Ballets. Some of the many dance companies Seiskaya students have joined: ABT (5), Atlanta Ballet (2), Boston (2), Ballet West, Fort Worth, Hartford, Pacific Northwest, Pittsburgh, Royal Swedish, State Ballet of Missouri, Ballet Arizona, Tennessee, Milwaukee (3), New Jersey, Alabama, Washington, Louisville, Austin, Tulsa Ballets and Momix.

In 1994 Seiskaya student Michael Cusumano captured a bronze medal and Special Commendation at the International Ballet Competition (IBC) in Varna, Bulgaria and a coveted Jury Award (a gold medal-level award) at the *Prix de Danse*, Paris, France. Valia Seiskaya was nominated that year as the Best Teacher and Coach at Varna, one of the few Americans ever to be so honored.

In 1996 Kirov student Rasta Thomas, coached by Valia Seiskaya, reached the pinnacle: a gold medal in the Men's Junior Division at the 17th IBC, Varna, Bulgaria. Incredibly, he was the first American male dancer ever to win a Junior Division gold and the youngest male dancer ever to do so. In addition, his triumph ended a sixteen-year stretch in which no gold medal was awarded in the Junior Men's Division.

In 1998 Seiskaya student Elizabeth McGrath represented the U.S. in the 18th IBC in Varna, Bulgaria. In late '98 she was a top finalist in the 8th Concours International de Danse de Paris, France. Among the numerous awards earned during the current decade: Anna Craddock earned 2nd prize in the 2008 American Ballet Competition, Miami, Fl. and in 2009, the grand prize in the 9th International Dance Competition - Hellas (Greece). Seiskaya alum Cory Stearns (ABT principal) won the vaunted 2008 Erik Bruhn Prize in Toronto, Canada. Karissa Kralik captured 2nd place honors in the 2010, Senior Division, American Ballet Competition. In 2012, Danielle Lovetro earned 2nd place in the regional Youth American Grand Prix while Anna Craddock swept to a 1st place finish at the American Ballet Competition in Houston, Texas and a 1st place finish in the senior division at the 2013 YAGP regional. Seiskaya students have captured more than twenty national/regional awards, including those from the National Arts and Letters Competition; National Arts Recognition and Talent Competition (Presidential Scholar in the Arts); Saraband, Ltd; and the Amilita Hoffman Memorial Ballet Competition.

During her seventeen-year professional career with the National Opera of Greece, Mme. Seiskaya gained an affinity for the grand sweep of story-line ballets and operas staged by the company. Her own choreographic works, such as **Street** People, Las Damiselas, Forest, MASK, and the Nutcracker, reflect that interest. Fresh interpretations of classical favorites La Boutique Fantasque, Walpurgis Night and A Night on Bald Mountain complement her signature ensemble works Grand Waltz, Seasons and Dance of the Hours.

Valia Seiskaya is listed in Who's Who Among Outstanding Americans and was The Village Times 1985 Woman of the Year in the Arts. Thrice, she has been awarded Teacher of the Year by YAGP. She has received commendations from, among others, President Reagan, Governor Pataki and Congressman Forbes. In 2011, Mme. Seiskaya was elected to the Long Island Volunteer Hall of Fame for her work nurturing young talented dancers. Valia Seiskaya is Long Island's grande dame of ballet.

FRANCIS LAWRENCE

Francis was born in Melbourne, Australia and originally studied under Lorraine Blackbourn. From there he was accepted into the Australian Ballet School where he graduated with a diploma in dance. Whilst studying at the school he toured with the Australian Ballet Dancers Company tour for two years and also danced recently with The Australian Ballet Company in John Neumeier (Nijinsky) & Peggy Van Praagh (Coppelia). Upon arriving in the states Francis joined New York Theatre Ballet for their 30th Anniversary season. Shortly after, he went on to join The Grand Rapids Ballet Company in Michigan for three seasons, under the direction of Patricia Barker. Whilst there, he danced repertoire by George Balanchine, Twyla Tharp, Jose Limon, Paul Taylor, Ulysses Dove, Lew Christensen, Olivier Weavers and Mario Radacovsky. Francis danced for five seasons with The Dance Theatre of Harlem under the direction of Virginia Johnson. He has performed works by choreographers such as George Balanchine (Agon, Glinka & Tchaikovsky Pas De Deux), Alvin Ailey (Lark Ascending), Frederick Franklin (Raymonda), Marius Petipa (Black Swan Pas De Deux), Robert Garland (Return, Gloria & New Bach) and Glen Tetley (Dialogues). Most recently Francis is performing in the North American tour of An American In Paris, choreographed and directed by Christopher Wheeldon.



A former Principal dancer with Seiskaya Ballet, Lara performs with us once again. She will be showcasing her multifaceted dancing ability as the serene and solemn role of *Time* in **Dance of the Hours**, while taking on **Swan Lake's** daring, wicked, and vivacious *Black Swan Variation*. A freshman student at Fordham University studying mathematics and economics, Lara continues to keep ballet an integral part of her life.



Character Dance Minatures

A testament to Mme. Guzikova's ingenuity, *Oriental* and *Gypsy* character dances are a blend of energetic synchronized choreographic patterns, vibrant colored costumes with enchanting folk rhythms that yield toe-tapping and finger-snapping excitement. The Character Ballet Teacher for several years at ABT, she often collaborated on BESFI projects.

Dance of the Hours
A delightful score drawn from Ponchielli's opera La Gioconda, the ballet Dance of the **Hours** features three principals with a corps de ballet of twelve dancers. Set in part as a White Ballet, the choreography highlights the corps during slow passages and allows the vibrant music to be utilized for virtuoso solo performances. The Seiskaya adaptation features three demanding roles: Day, Night, and *Time*. The ballet recounts the timelessness of the struggle between Day and Night as each claims its due. All three roles are tests for the respective ballerinas. Day is quite lyrical and poignant, *Night* requires a bravura display, while *Time*, which is a melding of both night and day, combines elements of both. Numerous Seiskaya dancers have distinguished themselves in these roles that have, coincidentally, been springboards to careers.

Raymonda Pas de Deux

A Petipa ballet set to the music of Glazounov, *Raymonda* has become a classical yardstick for ballerinas. Raymonda dreams that her lover, who is away at war, descends from his portrait and leads her into the garden to dance a pas de deux. But the vision is dispelled and in her lover's place she finds the sinister Saracen who renews his advances.

William Tell Pas de Deux

Set to the glorious score by Rossini, this ballet by the great Danish ballet master Bournonville, has an interesting story. One popular version of this ballet has it originating as a divertissement in the original production of Rossini's **William Tell**, which was first performed at the Paris Opera on August 3, 1829.

divertissement, La Bayadère's Kingdom of the Shades portrays the Underworld and the spirits or "shades" that inhabit it. Known for its simple yet physically challenging choreography, we watch as Solor's grief following *Nikiya's* death transports him to the netherworld.

Spanish Dance from Swan Lake

Tchaikovsky's earlier Swan Lake (1876) had a set of national dances in Act III, danced by the eligible maidens at Prince Siegfried's ball: a Hungarian Czardas, a Spanish dance, a Neapolitan dance, and a Polish mazurka.

Black Swan Variation

The duality in Swan Lake has long captivated audiences for its versatility and its hypnotizing musical score. Odile, also known as the Black Swan has duped Prince Siegfried into believing that she is the innocent *Odette*. Bewitching the prince with her wicked pirouettes, she ensnares him into marriage like a black widow.

Paquita Variation


Paquita, a Spanish gypsy, loves Lucien, a French nobleman. Marriage is impossible because of their difference in social status. All turns out well when Paquita discovers that she is the daughter of a nobleman. Paquita's wedding pas de deux encompasses seven widely different variations performed by her bridesmaids. These variations vary from delicate and controlled adagio to bravura grand allegro. This ballet through history has given dancers the opportunity to showcase their strengths.

WALPURGIS NIGHT

Originally choreographed by Leonid Lavrovsky, this ballet was first presented by the Bolshoi Ballet in Moscow in 1941. Since the original staging, numerous versions have become staples in ballet company repertoire the world over. Aballet drawn from the opera Faust, Walpurgis Night loosely depicts the celebration of Bacchus (the god of wine and revelry), the Bacchantes (his priestesses), and Satyrs (his demigod attendants) on the eve of May Day. Joining the festivities, but beyond Bacchus' power are the Three Graces. The final scene brings to a close an evening of frenzied merriment.


VIVIAN ZIJIA YE – Age 16 Ward Melville High School Eleventh Grade







From an unassuming kiosk at the Smith Haven Mall food court, Kai Wang prepares some of the most interesting bowls of ramen and Japanese bites on Long Island. The chef cut his teeth at David Chang's Momofuku empire as well as the modern Korean ramen house Jeju Noodle Bar, which has been called the most affordable Michelin-starred restaurant in New York City. At Yume (which means "dream"), he embraces seasonal cooking and plays with unexpected flavor



combinations, like macadamia nuts on a plate of spicy edamame beans. Truffle's earthy aroma catches your nose as a tray appears from the kitchen holding shiitake mushroom skewers that have been graced with soy sauce and Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese.

Wang's kombu chicken ramen (\$12.99), with its artfully arranged toppings of little fish cake flowers floating in a crystalline pond of scallions, evokes a tranquil feeling like looking into a Japanese woodblock print. This may actually be the dreamiest dish on the menu, and is delightfully lighter than you expect a ramen to be. But you can see that a lot of time and skill went into it, as the roasted chicken is just right and the hot broth is elegant yet comforting and homey.
